November 7 - December 6, 2026, and
December 12, 2026 - February 14, 2027
Daily Limit: 50

Ducks, Mergansers, and Coots

November 14 - December 6, 2026 and
December 12, 2026 - January 31, 2027

Oklahoma State Hunting Regulations

It is the hunter's responsibility to familiarize themselves with state and federal laws and regulations regarding hunting waterfowl. State regulation booklets include:

- Types of hunting licenses
- License requirements and exemptions
- License costs
- Special licenses and permits
- Hunter Education requirements and class dates

Hunting at Lake Sahoma

Minor children (under the age of 18) can hunt, or accompany hunting adults, according to Oklahoma State Hunting Regulations. All minor children under the age of 18 **must** be accompanied by an adult while hunting.

City Permits

- Applicants must exhibit a valid Oklahoma Hunting License issued to the applicant for the current year and shall have complied with all applicable state and federal regulations prior to applying for a City Hunting Permit.
- Applicants must fully complete and submit a City of Sapulpa Hunting Permit Application prior to receiving a City Hunting Permit. These forms remain on file with the Sapulpa Parks Office and the Office of the City Clerk.
- City Hunting Permits are non-transferrable and must be carried on your person at all times while hunting.
- City Hunting Permits must be visibly posted on the blind at all times while hunting.
- **All hunters must sign in and out every day you hunt.**
- Permits expire on the last day of the 2026-2027 season.

Hunting

- Federal and State laws are always in force.
- Unless exempt, all hunters must exhibit valid state and federal duck stamps.
- All hunters must have a current State Hunting License **and** City Hunting Permit prior to hunting.
- All hunters must submit a Daily Hunting Log to the Sahoma Bait Shop every day they hunt.
- Hunting from boats is only allowed if the boat is directly in front of an approved and designated blind location.
- When not in use, boats left by owners beside the duck blind must be securely docked.
- Prohibited items:
 - Ammunition that is toxic or not steel
 - Shooting of rifles or pistols of any caliber and shotguns loaded with shot larger than size No.
- Hunting is only allowed from City approved blind locations. Hunting from boats is allowed only if an approved blind structure is in place and if the boat is anchored directly in front of the blind.
- All decoys must be removed from the Lake after hunting is completed that day.

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Failure to comply with any of the established rules, regulations, laws, codes, etc. may result in loss of hunting privileges and/or fines.

Duck Blinds

There is a total of thirteen designated duck blind locations on Lake Sahoma. (See Map)

Duck Blind Locations on Sahoma Lake

A blind location is assigned to one to three people. The assigned person/people shall be responsible for the construction and deconstruction of the blind. They cannot transfer their duck blind rights to any other person. Due to the limited number of blind locations, only one blind location is allowed per family.

Construction of all blind locations must be completed at least three days prior to the opening day of September Teal Season or the blind location shall be given to the first person who applies for its use. At least a 200-yard safety zone is required between all blind locations. All blinds must be completely removed within fourteen days after the end of the season.

In order to be eligible to participate in the Lake Sahoma Duck Blind Drawing, all applicants must have a current City of Sapulpa Hunting Permit. Hunting Permits are placed in a drawing box. One permit/name will be drawn at a time by lake custodian or a Sapulpa Parks employee. As each permit/name is drawn, that individual will select their desired blind location. The drawing shall continue until all blinds are reserved.

At least one of the blind holders must be at Lake Sahoma concession one hour before legal shooting time (as determined by Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation) in order to claim their blind for the day. If the blind is not claimed by that time, the lake custodian will give it to the first person making a request.

Duck blind holders failing to comply with Provisions Applicable to Lake Sahoma Duck Blinds in City Ordinances Sec 11-418, forfeit their blind for the current year. It is the blind holder's responsibility to familiarize themselves with these provisions.

Clarification on Hunting Blind Construction:

As per City Ordinance, "Construction of these blinds shall be entirely completed at least three days prior to the opening of Teal Season or the blind shall be given to the first person making application for it." We realize that hunters camouflage their blinds by use of either natural means (e.g. brush, sticks, leaves) which may be considered "permanent" versus the other means some hunters are permitted to use to camouflage for their blind(s), namely such as camouflage netting kits, which are purchased by the individual hunter(s), set up for the day of their hunt, and then subsequently removed by the hunter(s) at the end of their day's hunt.

Due to the fact that netting is the property of the hunter(s), and that leaving such up on the blind at all times for the entire duration of the hunting season may put the hunter(s)'s property in jeopardy of being stolen at any time, we will not mandate that hunter(s) leave their camouflage netting investment up on their blind location. Therefore, we still consider a hunting blind to have been legally constructed even though the camouflaging is not a permanent part of said blind.

It is required that all hunters who use the temporary camouflage kits (e.g. netting) advise staff at the time of receiving a duck blind location. Subsequently, any hunter legally desiring to use said blind, has permission to place brush, sticks, leaves, etc., on the blind for the day's hunt. They will not be required to remove these items at day's end.
